Letter 1. From Borough Deans

Dear Colleagues,
Another major idea to come from the Borough Deans grouping is to run a one day Christian festival in Brent in summer 2011. We would hope to approach Brent council and ask for a public space and we would plan a day of music, speakers, stalls, prayer, entertainment for the family, etc etc. Once again we are asking you to think and pray as to whether you have anyone in your communities who would be interested in working as part of the planning team, or indeed in being a co-ordinator of the festival and team leader? We would need people with some of the following gifts: organisation, making things actually happen as opposed to talking about them, dealing with people, finance and fund raising, communication, publicity, local knowledge, prayer and vision. Please think seriously over the next few weeks whether you have such people among you- they could be some of your existing leaders, a recently retired person, someone who is bored and not stretched in their current position, a younger person waiting for a job and needing valuable experience, or someone who sits quietly at the back in your services and is just waiting to be approached.....Or someone completely different!

This could be a wonderful day for Christians in Brent – please support us in these early planning stages

Letter 2. From Borough Deans

Dear Colleagues,
You may or may not know that in Brent the Borough Leaders of each Christian denomination meet together regularly to pray and work together and to be a united voice for Christians in Brent. This grouping is called the Borough Deans and represents Methodists, Baptists, Roman Catholics, the free churches and Anglicans.

One of the things we would like to start up is a quarterly magazine to go out to members of the borough council, libraries, leisure centres and other public places to raise the profile of all the Christians in the Borough, include some elements of the gospel message or teaching, and show the huge range of activities that we run for all sectors of the community, and demonstrate that we are an organised body representing a substantial majority of Brent residents. We are imagining a 16 page A4 colour publication with articles, photos, interviews, comments, and some advertising from Christian businesses.

In order to make this happen we will need an editor and a small editorial team with a range of skills, a friendly printer who could do things at cost price for us, and people/ churches prepared to sponsor it.

This Email is to ask you first of all if you have anyone in your congregations / contacts who could fit any of these roles, and secondly, even if no one springs to mind, could you publicise the requests in your churches/communities so that hidden talent may be aired! It shouldn't be beyond the bounds of possibility to make this happen.

We think that this is a really important way for Christians to present a united profile across the borough and hope that you will support it in whatever ways you can, and especially in prayer.
